This is a **new role** to our Home and will be a **member of our management team**. In this **hybrid role**, you will spend part of your time in your RN capacity, provide professional nursing care to our residents, and then the remainder of your time will be spent in the role of ADOC, assisting the Director of Care and our full-time ADOC with the oversight of all nursing care within the Home. **We anticipate the role will work 6 shifts RN/ 4 shifts ADOC in each two-week period.**

**RN duties** will include: assessing, planning, implementing and evaluating the care for each resident, performing personal nursing care as well as palliative care (when required), communicating with resident family members and being an effective liaison with our medical director and attending physicians.

Your **ADOC responsibilities** will include: working closely with our DoC and the full-time ADOC in providing effective supervision of front-line clinical staff, ensure care meets compliance requirements, assist in identifying areas of improvement for staff development and work with the DOC to ensure overall effectiveness of training.

- Registration in good standing as a Registered Nurse (RN) with the College of Nurses of Ontario.
- Comprehensive knowledge of nursing and health care practices and techniques in long-term care.
